Point Grondine Park Celebrates Major Milestone with Opening of New Lake Access Road and Waterfront Development

Point Grondine, ON – October 10, 2025 – Point Grondine Park, a premier Indigenous-led ecotourism destination owned and operated by the **Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory**, is proud to announce and welcome visitors to the official opening of its **new lake access road and waterfront development** on **October 10 at 11:30 AM**.

This new infrastructure marks a significant phase in the continued development of the **Point** Grondine Eco Resort and Campground, a project envisioned to blend Anishinaabe ecological preservation with sustainable tourism. The development opens access to future eco cabin sites, a lakefront recreational area, and a planned Outdoor Learning Center of Excellence.

The event will take place at Point Grondine Park, 675 Highway 637, beginning with welcoming remarks from Ogimaa Tim Ominika and Tourism Manager Luke Wassegijig, followed by a traditional blessing and honour song, lunch, and a guided tour of the campground and waterfront.

"The Point Grondine Park vision is coming to life. This current phase of construction was crucial in creating access to the waterfront, discovery center and expanding our eco cabins. This new development surely will create a safer and more enjoyable user experience." said Luke Wassegijig, Tourism Manager, Wikwemikong Development Commission.

A Vision Rooted in the Land

Since its opening in 2016 as a **backcountry wilderness park**, Point Grondine has stood as a testament to Anishinaabe stewardship, cultural preservation, and environmental responsibility. In 2022, the Park began development of its eco resort and campground, with **12 campground sites and 1 eco cabin** officially opening in 2024.

Construction of the new lake access road and waterfront area began in winter 2025, led by the **Wikwemikong Development Commission** with support from:

- FedNor
- Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation (NOHFC)
- SITES Grant (administered through the National Aboriginal Capital Corporation Association NACCA)
- Indigenous Services Canada
- Wii'ni n'gutchtood LMS,
- Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory

This community-driven project reflects the long-standing vision of past leadership to establish a thriving Indigenous tourism experience on ancestral lands. The park's mission is to preserve and protect the rich ecological diversity of the area while creating opportunities for economic



development, employment, and the respectful sharing of traditional knowledge.

Looking Ahead

The next phase of development, targeted for completion by 2026, will include:

- 28 non-serviced campground sites
- 8 Serviced RV Sites
- 5 sustainable eco cabins
- Gatehouse/Comfort Station
- Outdoor Learning Center of Excellence

A full opening of these features is expected by 2027, further solidifying Point Grondine Park as a signature Indigenous tourism experience in Northern Ontario.
