



Campground Rules

**2024 Campground sites are all non-serviced, non-electric with no water hook ups in Park.
All campers must bring potable water.**

1. All campers must be registered at the Campground Office.
 - a. **CHECK IN TIME IS 3PM. CHECK OUT TIME IS 1PM.**
 - b. **All campers are permitted one vehicle with their permit. Additional Parking passes can be purchased.**
 - c. **Campground sites are all non-serviced, non-electric with no water hook ups in Park. All campers must bring potable water.**
2. One family (parents and their dependents) OR a maximum of 4 adults per campsite is permitted.
3. Visiting hours are 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Only registered campers are permitted to remain in the park or enter outside of visiting hours.
4. No excessive noise at any time. All musical instruments and audio devices must be turned off at 11 p.m.
5. Other than when otherwise prohibited by park management, alcoholic beverages may be possessed and consumed on the occupied/rented campsites only. Possession and consumption by any person must be in compliance with the Ontario Liquor License Act.
6. Cannabis may be consumed by campers at their registered campsite. Smoking tobacco or cannabis, or using an electronic cigarette (vaping), is permitted on a registered campsite only. Campers must dispose of their cigarette butts.

7. **Garbage Policy:** Campers and Park visitors are responsible for their garbage and recyclables.
 - a. The campground will enforce a 1 garbage bag and 1 recycling bag policy.
Campers will be given a garbage tag upon check-in.
 - b. Garbage/recyclable must be bagged and placed at the garbage pick-up between 3-4pm daily.
 - c. Recyclables must be rinsed (at your campsite) and sorted into plastics and aluminum/steel food and beverage containers.
 - d. Any excess garbage/recyclables must be taken with the camper.
 - e. Please remember to always be bear wise and store food in secure area. We strongly encourage no trace camping, only leave footprints.
8. Day visitors please take your garbage and recycling with you.
9. There is no potable water or showers in the campground, and all potable water is the camper's responsibility. All drinking water must be purified via a rolling boil, purifying crystals, or a water filter.
10. There are two designated privies located in the campground and they must be kept as clean and natural as possible. Do not dump garbage, sanitary products or food scraps into privies
11. There is no trailer pump out available at the campground and absolutely no dumping of waste on Point Grondine Reserve lands.
12. Every person using a campsite shall at all times maintain the campsite in a condition satisfactory to Park Management. When vacating the campsite, they shall restore the campsite as near as possible to its original condition.

13. The owner or person in control of a domestic pet must maintain physical control of the animal.
 - a. Leashes must be no greater than 2 meters in length.
 - b. Domestic animals are not permitted in swimming areas. Owners are responsible to clean up after their pets and bag their waste.
14. Campfires are permitted in designated fire pits only. No person shall start or maintain a fire, except in a designated fire pit.
 - a. If a fire is out of control the Park Guardians must immediately be notified to prevent any out-of-control fire. If Guardians are not available, please call 911.
Cell phone reception can be found at the entrance of the 705 Road 1km towards Killarney.
15. Scavenging for firewood from Park lands is prohibited. Purchase firewood from the Campground Office. This is to protect our forest from campers, invasive insects, and pathogens.
16. No person shall pick or remove flowers, plants, trees, or wildlife, or take any natural souvenirs from the park.
17. No person shall remove, damage or deface Park property or damage or deface any relict, artifact, or natural object or any site of archaeological or historical interest.
 - a. The Point Grondine lands are a living history site, and several high value cultural sites are within the park boundaries, we ask visitors to respect these sites and do not remove artifacts from areas.
18. The maximum speed on main park roads is 20 km/h. Please abide by these speed limits.

19. No person camping in the park shall operate an All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV), dirt bikes or any off-road vehicle anywhere on the park property, including trails. NO motorized boats are permitted by park users.
20. Generators are permitted between 12pm-2pm. Use beyond these permitted times is prohibited. Invertor generators are encouraged.
21. Avoid damaging vegetation by staying on the trails. Please do not disturb or harass wildlife.
22. No person shall pick or remove flowers, plants, trees, or wildlife, or take any natural souvenirs from the park.

Non-compliance with park rules may result in charges and/or eviction.
